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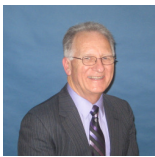

On February 2, 1984, President Ronald Reagan spoke at the Annual National Prayer Breakfast in the International Ballroom at the Washington Hilton Hotel. After greeting the assembly, President Reagan said: "In our world today that is so torn with strife that seems to be increasing and there are divisions among people everywhere, have we ever thought about the greatest tool that we have to use? The power of prayer and God's help." There is a story that goes back to the fourth century that makes this point clearly"

There was a man that lived in a remote village in the 4th century. His name was Telemachus. He went to Rome because he believed God wanted him to do so. When he arrived it was at a time of a celebration because of Rome's victory over the Goths. He followed a crowd into the Coliseum and saw the gladiators stand before the Emperor. Their proclamation was, "We who are about to die salute you." He realized they were going to fight to the death for the entertainment of the crowds. He cried out, "In the name of Christ, stop!" As the games began, he made his way down through the crowd and climbed over the wall and dropped to the floor of the arena. Suddenly the crowds saw this scrawny and poorly dressed man making his way out to the gladiators and repeating the same phrase, "In the name of Christ, stop." The gladiators thought it was part of the entertainment and they laughed. Finally they realized it wasn't part of the program, and they became angry. However, Telemachus was pleaded with the gladiators, "In the name of Christ, stop," One of them plunged his sword into his body and as he fell to the sand dying his last words were, "In the name of Christ, stop." Suddenly, a strange thing happened. The gladiators stood looking at this tiny form on the ground. A silence fell over the Coliseum and one individual after another made their way to the exit and left and many others began to follow. In the dead silence, everyone left the Coliseum. That was the last battle to the death between gladiators in the Roman Coliseum. Never again did men kill each other for the entertainment of the crowd. How did all of this happen?

One tiny voice that could hardly be heard above the tumult proclaimed: "In the name of Christ, stop." It is something we could be saying to each other throughout the world today. Peace is what we need in the world. Peace between countries, peace in our homes, peace within each of us, and especially peace with God. That's why God sent His Son into the world. The way we have this peace is the removing of our sin by God's forgiveness. (Isaiah 59:1-2) Jesus died on the cross to pay the price for our sins so that we can be reconciled to God as Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 5:18-21). God will forgive and give eternal life to those who place their faith and trust in Jesus by turning from their sins in repentance then confessing Jesus before people, and being baptized into Christ for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38). God will continue to cleanse from sin those who continue to walk in the light of His Word Therefore we must proclaim as Telemachus did, "In the name of Christ, stop!" Stop fighting against God and one another. Surrender and submit to the will of God in obedience and share His Gospel with everyone.
